# How Can Funds Be Used?

Up to 80% of the 2021 Covid Relief Funding (ESSER III funds) can be invested in your facilities for improvements to learning environments, to aid in the reduction of the spread of Covid-19 and other viruses. Districts must obligate ESSER III funds by September 30, 2024. According to the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE), funds may be used for a wide range of activities to address needs arising from the coronavirus pandemic.

# What Projects Qualify?

Our research shows that funds can be used for a variety of facility improvements including but not limited to:

A Repairing and improving school facilities to reduce risk of virus transmission and exposure to environmental health hazards.

#### **Potential Opportunities**

- Upgrading handwashing fixtures and hand sanitation stations;
- Improving controlled entries;
- Touchless technologies such as door hardware, light switches, and plumbing fixtures;
- Cafeteria, kitchen and servery improvements;
- Renovating libraries and shared learning spaces;
- Improving classrooms to enhance learning, connectivity and flexibility;
- Installation of distance and hybrid learning systems.

B Improving indoor air quality.

#### **Potential Opportunities**

- Classroom air quality and ventilation systems;
- Cafeteria air quality and ventilation systems;
- Gymnasium, and multi-purpose room air quality and ventilation systems.

Access your facilities to determine capital improvement needs and schedule.



Review capital improvements and determine if they qualify for Covid Relief Funding. **Consult** with your district resources for guidance, including your Regional Office of Education.
